Amaranth Hopi Red Dye

110 days. Amaranthus. Hopi Red Dye was utilized by the Hopi as a source of red dye to make red cornbread. It is a valuable crop in several ways: the young tender plants make incredible purple salad greens, the edible black seeds can be ground to make a protein rich flour, and the dramatic deep reddish-purple clustered blooms make a great ornamental or cut flower. Untreated seeds.

Eruca sativa. 40 days. Arugula has been grown as a vegetable in the Mediterranean area since the Roman times; it was considered to be an aphrodisiac. Terrific green to spice up your salad mix. Spicy, dark green, lobed leaves form a loose open bunch. Untreated seeds.

It has a somewhat nutty flavor and mixes well with spinach, lettuce and other greens in salads. SOWING: Sow seeds outdoors in early spring and again in late summer through early fall for late crop. Cover seeds with 1/8 inch fine soil. SPACING: Space rows 12 to 18 inches apart, or plant in wide rows or beds for an eventual spacing of 6 to 8 inches apart in all directions. Thin to 6 to 8 inches apart in rows when plants are 2 inches tall; use thinned plants. Untreated seeds.

Lettuce Bronze Mignonette

Lactuca sativa. 62 days - First documented in 1898. This lettuce has small globular heads, a creamy-yellow center and bronze to green, frilled leaves. A very slow bolting variety that does well in hot, humid weather. Good variety for Southern gardens although somewhat susceptible to leaf tip burn.

Lettuce Oakleaf

Lactuca sativa. 40 days. The most heat resistant of the leaf types and almost never gets bitter. Oakleaf shaped leaves form around a loose center, tender and crisp. Good late season lettuce. First described in 1686. At one point known as 'American Oak Leaved'. Untreated seeds.

Lactuca sativa. 50 days. A miniature butterhead about the size of an apple with medium green, lightly crumpled leaves. It is solid, sweet and tender. Does well in gardens as well as containers, indoors and out. Excellent for those with limited space or small families. Untreated seeds.

Pepper Miniature Bell - Red

95 days. Cucurbita Pepo. Miniature, nicely shaped, 2-3OZ., 3-4" diameter pumpkins. Good orange color with nice deep ribs. Short vines need plenty of water. Untreated seeds.

Purslane, Garden

45 days. Portulaca oleracea. This is one of the best sources of omega 3 fatty acids in the plant kingdom. There is an enormous difference between wild and garden purslane. The garden purslane is upright in growth habit and has succulent leaves and stems twice as large as wild varieties. Direct seed in the spring.
